## ISKA Language Assessment and Referral Centre: Frequently Asked Questions

### What should I bring to my assessment?

You need to bring your immigration document.

### What can I expect at the assessment?

- A certified Language Assessor will assess you in listening, speaking, reading and writing.
- You will get a report at the end of our assessment showing your Canadian Language Benchmark for each skill.
- It could take up to 2.5 hours.
- The assessor will give you information about other government-funded settlement programs and language training classes and refer you to a program if you wish.
- Childminding is not available during the assessment.
- Cell phones must be turned off and remain in your bag.

### Does a CLB Assessment provide proof of English for citizenship purposes?

No, a CLB Language Assessment is not an acceptable document for proof of English for citizenship purposes. Please contact ISKA's Settlement Services for more information about proof of language requirements for citizenship or visit IRCC Proof of Language for Citizenship

### Can I take the assessment online?

Yes. You will need a laptop or computer with a webcam and an internet connection. Online assessments are conducted through an online testing site with the guidance of a certified language assessor.

### Can I take French language classes?

Yes. First, you need a French language assessment to determine your level. The assessor will tell you about courses available to you. Currently, in Kingston and Belleville, there are no in-person government-funded French language training, so you may need to access an online class. Contact the assessment centre to be referred to a French language assessment centre.
